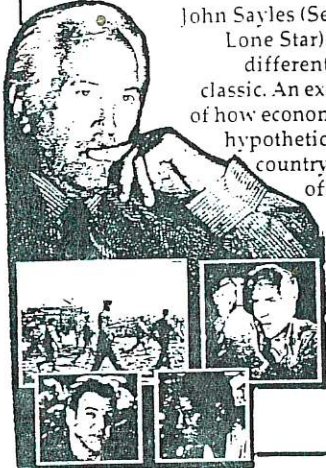

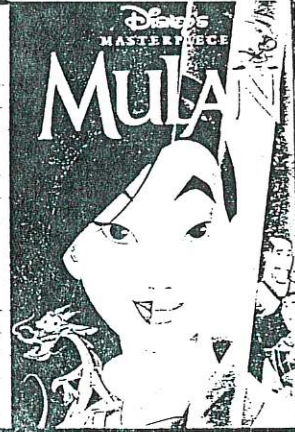
Men With Guns

becomes curious about the fates of a group of young physicians he sent into the interior to work with the natives. PG13 some violence, coarse language - mostly subtitled

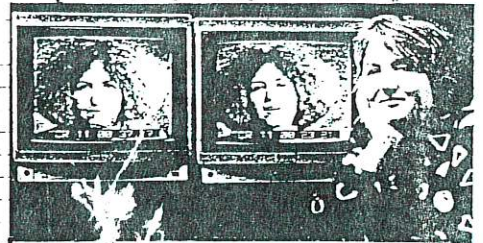
