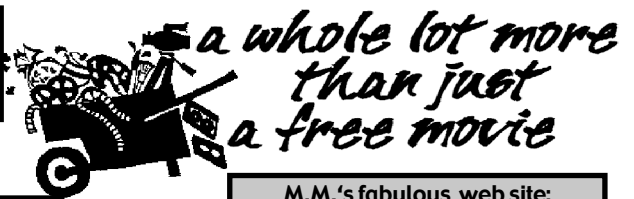

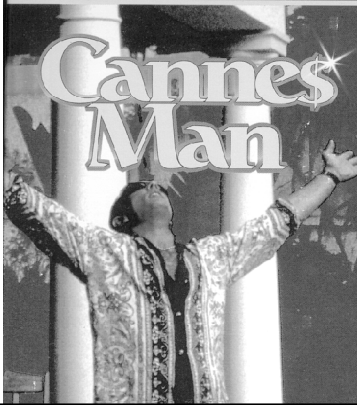
Crimes of Compassion

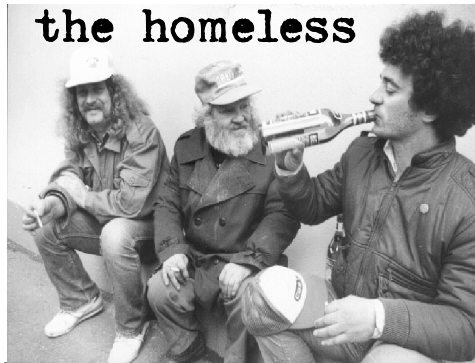
6:30 Monday Sept 16

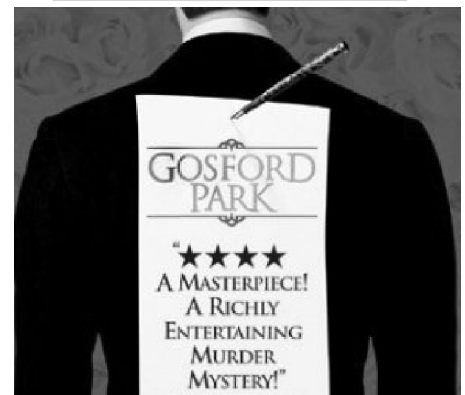
The Street: a film with the homeless
