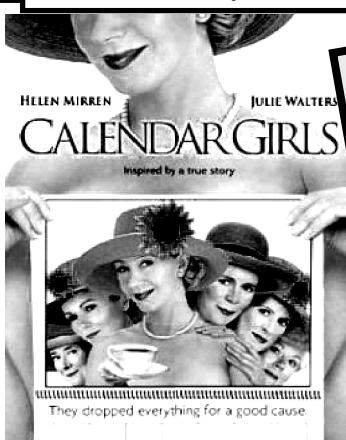

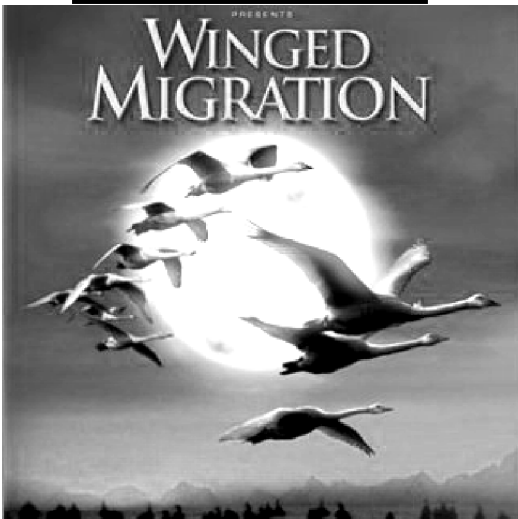

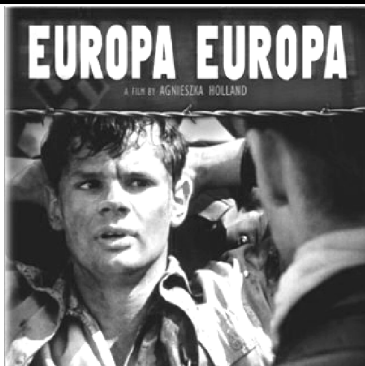

A Jewish boy separated from his family in the early days of WWII poses as a German orphan in Russia and is taken into the heart of the Nazi world as a war hero and eventually becomes a Hitler Youth. The protagonist becomes a kind of a Jewish "Little Big Man", illustrating a key period in world history as events place him dizzyingly on several sides of the strife. Remarkably adapted from a true memoir, this film won Golden Globe for Best Foreign Film and Oscar nomination for adapted screenplay, (1990 - France/Germany/Poland) and is a fit for upcoming Remembrance Day R (Nudity/Adult Situations)
