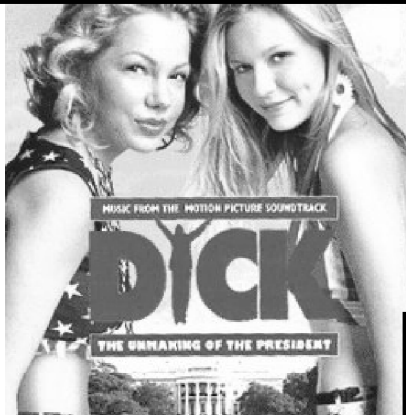

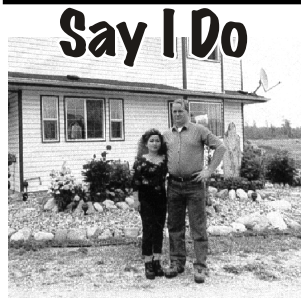

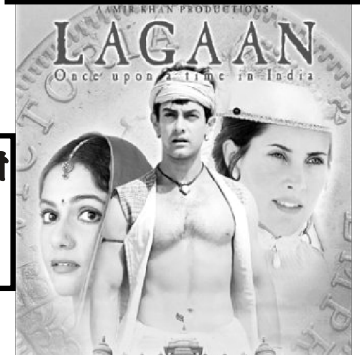

Plus Carolyn Wong's short film -A SLICE OF PRIMAL PIE also: CHOW DONG HOY - Portraits from the Frontier.
This documentary chronicles a Chinese immigrant's extraordinary life - from Vancouver in 1902 to the gold mines, forts and ranches of early British Columbia. As well as running a general store in the Cariboo, from his photography side line, Hoy left an invaluable archive of the people of early BC. Many of his subjects were Asian immigrants and Native Indians in their ordinary roles as workers, cowboys, housewives - a remarkable insight to life in our early West. G.

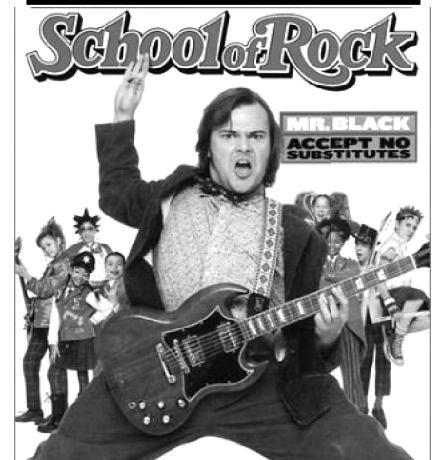
