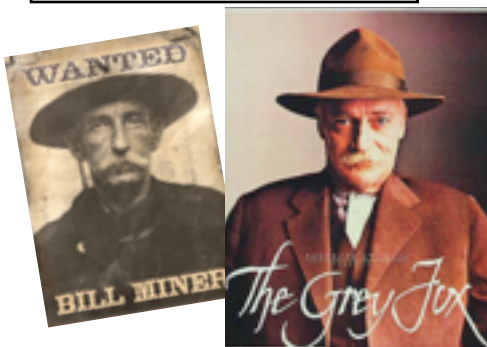


CRAZY HEART

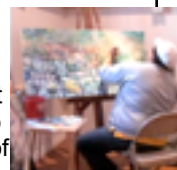
Three films by David Laing Dawson
