There's a strong Canadian hook too. Their favourite home was a magnificent estate in Cape Breton, site of many of Bell's accomplishments.

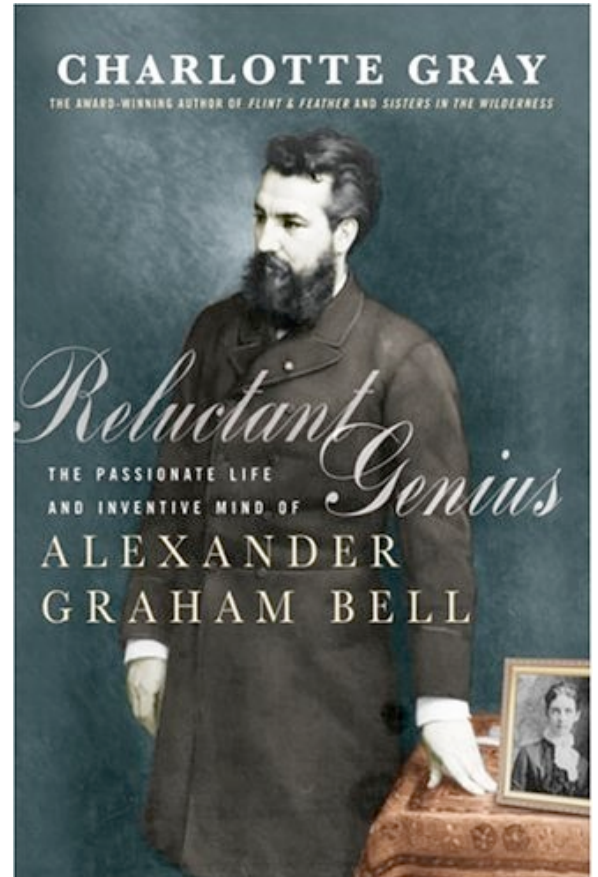
Come and celebrate this amazing life story at the Movie Monday Theatre and meet this renowned author.
