He taught Sunday school, sang in the church choir and was always willing to lend a helping hand. Everyone loved and appreciated Bernie, so it came as no surprise when he befriended an affluent widow (Shirley MacLaine) who was as well known for her sour attitude as her fortune. In 1995, after a 20-year struggle with bipolar disorder, Nina Leichter, a 63-year-old mother of two, a Senator's wife, took her own life. Sixteen years would pass before her daughter Kathy felt ready to delve into her story. She found a sometimes difficult marriage, her mom's sadness over her estrangement from her son, and her difficulties with mental illness. Audio recordings her mother left would ultimately form the backbone of this extraordinarily moving documentary. Driven by the need to understand and forgive Nina, and to explore the repercussions of her mother's illness and death on her family, Kathy's journey leads ultimately to a place of acceptance and letting-go. 75 min. 2012 Pg13

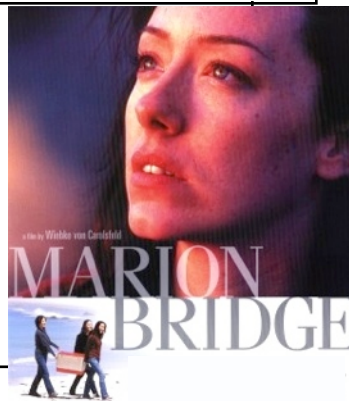

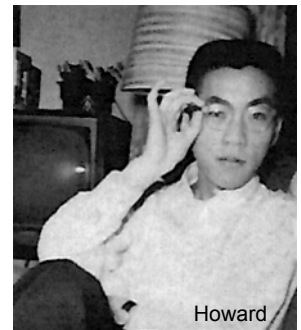
