MARINONI: The Fire In The Flame

Giuseppe Marinoni found his calling when he transitioned from champion cyclist to master bike craftsman. But after years, hunched over, welding in a haze of toxic fumes in his Quebec shop, his passion almost killed him.

Today we travel to Italy, at age 75, Marinoni is back in top shape, and attempting to beat the world hour record for his age group, all on a bike he built with his own hands almost 40 years ago. His perfectionism, combined with a curmudgeonly nature, makes him impatient with first-time director Tony Girardin, adding much humour to this inspiring film.

One of the most moving scenes involves Marinoni catching up with his dear friend Jocelyn Lovell, one of Canada's greatest cyclists during the 60s and 70s, whose storied career was sadly ended by a famous and fateful accident that left him a quadriplegic.

This is a film not only for the spandex-and-helmet crowd but for anyone who believes that a man's reach should exceed his grasp.
