Hi Bruce. That was a good evening. Thank you. And thanks for the info and pictures. Great stuff.

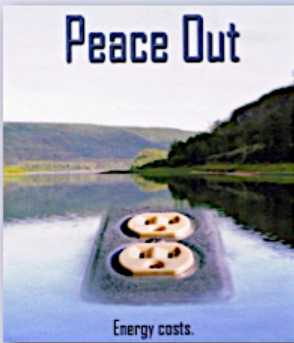

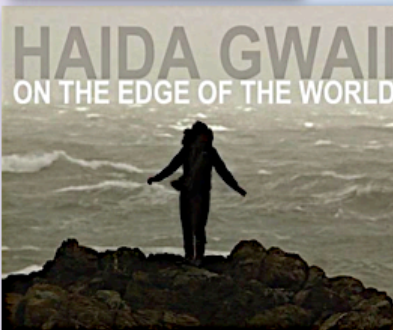
