MEET BEAU DICK: MAKER OF MONSTERS

Beau Dick was a Kwakwaka'wakw (Alert Bay area First Nation) artist and hereditary chief who died at 61 just last year as this documentary was being finished.

In this biography, directors LaTiesha Ti'si'tla Fazakas and Natalie Boll share an intimate profile of this charismatic man, with a particular focus on his work and his cultural-activist passion. Beau Dick's

remarkable work has been celebrated across the global art scene as vibrant expressions of West Coast Indigenous culture and a sophisticated crossover into the contemporary art world. Dick had an unprecedented ability to tap into the collective memory of his people and breathe new life into age - old traditions. Meet special guest, Linnea Dick Linnea Dick, Beau Dick's daughter, is an Indigenous writer, orator & activist, from the Nisga'a & Tsimshian nations on her mother's side and the Kwakwaka'wakw nation on her father's side. She became involved in indigenous activism in 2013 with a conviction to create social change and help heal the injustices faced by Indigenous people. Through this work, she began to heal and recognize her purpose in life - to advocate for indigenous youth, culture and sexual assault victims through public speaking and, later, curating. Her late father is one of her greatest inspirations in life, while she continues on her own path in life. Her hope is to inspire others to speak their truths and create a space where they can share their gifts, too.

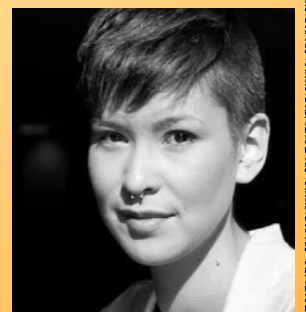
