Three films by Jordan Manley

CROSSING HOME: A Skier's Journey This is the finale of a series by Jordan Manley, a world travelling skier and filmmaker. Chad Sayers and Forrest Coots go back to the beginning - British Columbia. Embarking on a 3 week expedition, they boat, bushwack, ski, and packraft over the spine of the Coast mountains. A soulful meditation on the attachment to the land, from the Chilcotin to the West Coast, a cast of characters help them understand what that home truly means. 28min 2016



CURVE OF TIME Due to climate change, ski seasons will be markedly shorter by 2050. Lower elevations will receive significantly less snowfall. Professional skiers Greg Hill & Chris Rubens peer into the future and have a conversation with their future selves, contemplating the sobering forecast and the impact their thirst for adventure has on the very environment that sustains and fulfills them. With an eye on the clock, they launch themselves into an experiment: can they each remain committed skiers while significantly reducing their carbon footprints? 23min 2017

TREELINE Manley's latest film, celebrates the forests on which humans have always depended. Follow a group of snow-seekers, scientists and healers to the birch groves of Japan, the red cedars of British Columbia, and the bristlecones of Nevada, as they explore an ancient story written in rings, roots and snow. Manley documents the fragile nature of some of the world's beautiful ecosystems, and some amazing skiing and riding along the way. 40min 2018
