Dear Dr. Parfitt:

Thank you for your letter of July 12. I agree that the whole style of delivery of services and perhaps even Government's relationship to citizens will be modified significantly in part as a result of the OFY and LIP-type operations.

It may even have an effect on our political system insofar as the Members of Parliament are having to deal with the pluralism of their constituencies in the process of making recommendations to the Minister for approval of projects.

I have enclosed Volume 1 of the Calgary study and a somewhat more comprehensive report that incorporates some of the Calgary material and considerably more of the material which is resulted from an employee survey of LIP.

Further studies are taking place this summer, and material on the 1973/74 program may well be available before your meeting in October. In any case, I would look forward to an opportunity to meet with you either in Vancouver or when you are in Ottawa in October to discuss this further.

If I can be of further assistance, please let me know.
